Eucharistic Reflection for Magnificat

Like those on the road to Emmaus, we are all on a journey with Jesus as He breaks opens the Word and we recognize Him ever anew in the Breaking of the Bread. As a Church in the United States we are preparing for the journey to Indianapolis and



our First National Eucharistic Congress since 1978, and thus during this time of our national Eucharistic Revival it is a great time to reflect and deepen our love of Jesus present in the Eucharist.

The Gospel of St. John chapter 6 offers us an amazing theology of the Eucharist from the very mouth of the Lord. After Jesus miraculously feeds the multitudes at the beginning of the chapter with five loaves and two fish (vs. 9), He goes on to explain the greater miracle is still to come. "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (vs. 35).

Jesus comes to us at every Mass to feed, nourish, heal, comfort, and fill us with His very Life. The Church has celebrated this mystery since the Last Supper and down through the two millennia of Christianity to today. What a gift to know that we are linked to this amazing, unbroken, and historical lineage. Thus, if Jesus is inviting us to this amazing banquet every Sunday, how could we ever miss this miraculous nourishment by God Himself? I am so privileged as a priest and bishop to offer and receive this gift every day at Mass. Let us long for His Eucharistic Presence in our hearts and receive him as often as we possibly can.



Our Magnificat ministry centers around a meal, as does all of Jesus' ministry! Let us make sure that we never neglect those closest to us, and lock in meals with our families and friends at least 2-3 times a week. We are also Mary's advocates for her Son, so let us reach out to invite others to the best meal of their life at the Table of the Lord so that they too can have their hungers satisfied by the Bread of Life Himself (link to my new diocesan initiative called <u>Back to the Table</u>.)



Our attendance number has reached the limit of what the building's fire marshal code allows.

But what certainly has taken us by the most surprise was our experience of convention in Pittsburg in October. We found ourselves in the midst of Magnificat's great leaders, and somehow, we were seen fit to be a part of it. What a joy and freedom it brought to be able to lift our hands and voices in highest praise! What an honor it was to be able to sit among other Service Team members from all over! What excitement it brought to be able to listen to and to learn from amazing speakers and fellow brothers and sisters in Christ! The Lord is good to us, indeed.




